Guitar 2 Course Syllabus Mr. Marsh (amarsh@staff.gtchs.org) 2024-2025

Description and Organization: This course is for students interested in continuing their learning of the Guitar. Students should have a good foundation of skills before taking this course. We will expand our knowledge of music by further concentration on music reading, chord study, playing by ear, and composition. Students will be expected to showcase their progress to the school community during the year.

Initially we will begin with a review so that all students have a minimum level of knowledge and skills. Once we have established that we will move into new areas of development. As student musicians become better on their own, they will be expected to share their advances with the class and collaborate to perform. Students will have many projects to arrange, compose, and transpose music as they grow.

Course Objectives:

To teach students to teach themselves.

To encourage students to become lifetime learners and players.

To have students grow musically with their instrument.

To add music to the GTCHS community.

To cover the National Standards for Music Education:

- 1. Singing, alone and with others, a varied repertoire of music.
- 2. Performing on instruments, alone and with others, a varied repertoire of music.
- 3. Improvising melodies, variations, and accompaniments.
- 4. Composing and arranging music within specified guidelines.
- 5. Reading and notating music.
- 6. Listening to, analyzing, and describing music.
- 7. Evaluating music and music performances.

8. Understanding relationships between music, the other arts, and disciplines outside the arts.

9. Understanding music in relation to history and culture.

Course Topics:

Acoustics, Genres, Sheet music, Tabs, Playing by ear, Rehearsal technique, Performance technique, Professional musicianship, Composition, Arranging, Music Technology, Music History, Music Theory.

Required Supplies: Students need to bring a guitar to class every day. If a student does not have an instrument, they need to work with Mr. Marsh to find one. Acoustic guitars are preferred, students with electric guitars **must** provide reasonable amplification. Students that leave their instruments at school MUST lock them up in a room or locker every day. Students also need a three-ring binder with a notebook or looseleaf paper and a writing utensil every day. **Grading:** Grading will include daily participation, frequent playing tests, performance projects,

and semester exams.

Daily participation and Classwork includes being ready for class on time as well as showing a good work ethic both during group learning and individual practice time.

Playing tests and Quizzes include playing tests that may be played privately or in front of the class. These tests show whether or not a student is mastering the concepts assigned. This category also includes written quizzes.

Projects are larger in scope than playing tests. They may include solos or small group pieces that have been worked on for multiple days, as well as presentations or written work.

Unit tests include important prepared performances and written tests. *Semester exams* may be performance based and/or paper based. Participation and Classwork - 20% Smaller Playing Tests/Quizzes - 30% Projects - 30% Unit tests (written and playing) - 20% Semester Exam - 10% per semester

Performances: All performances are mandatory, and they count as part of your semester exams.

Grading for performances is as follows:

Communication: We will use Google Classroom for most of our class-related communication.
