# **GTCHS Student Service Hours** cont.

## Service Hour Timeframe:

- Returning students may work on service hours year-round.
- Student hours do roll over to the next year (and only the next year); students are required to have a minimum of 50 hours per year in order to be eligible to participate in extra-curricular activities and to march at graduation.
- Incoming 9th graders and new students may begin logging hours starting on June 1st.

## **Student Service Hour Documentation:**

Community service hour logs are due no later than the third Friday in May.

Students will receive Community Service Hour Logs from their Advisor. Students are individually responsible for keeping track of their service hours on the Community Service Hour Log Sheet.

If a student attends a school event offered for credit, they should get their program or ticket signed by an administrator or teacher at the end of the event, then turn it into their advisor.

#### What if we do not accumulate 50 hours?

If a student does not fulfill the community service requirement, that student will not walk at graduation. Hours are to be kept in your student's file and will be totaled at the end of 4 years.

# **GTCHS Student Service Hours**

In an effort to foster civic responsibility and engagement and to prepare our students to be well–rounded community members, students are required to complete 50 hours of service annually. At least 10 of these hours should be in school volunteering.

## **Student Service Opportunities:**

- Helping a teacher or staff member
- School-wide community service projects offered
- Attending school-sponsored fine arts
- Tutoring
- Yard work (excluding family members or able-bodied neighbors)
- Teaching Sunday School or assisting with other church activities
- Helping at a soup kitchen or food bank
- Volunteering at a hospital
- Working at an animal shelter
- Volunteering at a community event (ex. Fall for Greenville, United Ministries Walk for the Homeless, etc.)
- Volunteering at a nursing home (ex. Senior Action)
- Mission Trip up to 25 hours
- Carpool driver up to 10 hours (excludes family members)

# In general, service should help someone who is in need and can not help themselves

#### Hours that do <u>NOT</u> meet Service Hour Guidelines:

- Any activity for which one was paid
- An activity completed for family members (including grandparents, aunts, uncles, siblings, parents)
- Any activity receiving academic credit
- Donations of supplies, paper, etc. to the school

#### Service by grade-level through Advisories:

In our Advisories, we ask each group to choose a community project or service. This is another opportunity to acquire service hours.
